


Colors are a'swirling


All the prep is finished Pipes and sheets are set people bustle quilts to spaces For the deadline to be met.



A record 3-1/2 weeks. GREAT JOB!!



Finally, many many thanks to all the members who have given their time and talent to make our 2024 quilt show the best yet! It takes a village to have a successful quilt show!!



Do you, your friend, or your relative live on a well-travelled street? Do you know of a street intersection with stop signs or traffic signals where cars are moving slowly by or stopping? Perhaps you have a personal relationship with a shop owner? If yes to any of these questions, you've got the perfect place for a yard sign to advertise our upcoming Quilt Show! Advertising our show is the only way to make the public aware of our great event and encourage more to attend. This year, with so many political signs going up, good visibility for our signs is going to be challenging. Our signs will stand out best in your yards where they're not sitting in the middle of a herd of political signs.

The signs are set on wire stakes that press into the soil—no property damage, no need to hammer them in, just step on the stake to insert them! They're easy to handle. We recycle the signs for future shows, so we're looking for people to take responsibility for displaying the sign in mid-late September and removing and returning the sign after the show.

Welcome to our 2024- 2025 guild year.


