


Her topic was preparing your quilt for the long-arm quilter. She gave us great tips on how to make sure your quilt is prepared for quilting.

Our Quilts For Kids Charity







We continue to collect mug rugs for the 2024 Quilt Show and we currently have **363**. We will give out a mug rug as a free gift to every paid entry to the show. At the 2022 quilt show visitors expressed surprise and pleasure at receiving these gifts. Gina Grekula will collect completed mug rugs at our next few guild meetings prior to the show. Thanks to everyone who has contributed. They are fast and easy to make. Be creative and use your scraps.

Raffle tickets are available at every meeting. This year, to help keep our expenses down, we are asking members to pay for their raffle tickets (5 packs of 6 tickets for \$25) when they pick them up from Kelly Wenhold at the guild meeting. Please bring cash or check to do that! We encourage ALL members to participate. Raffle quilt ticket purchases help tremendously with the success of the quilt show! Welcome to our new member Charlean (Charlie) Brown. If you see her at the next meeting, please introduce yourself and get to know her.






Quilt Camp 2025 at Camp Innabah: Dates are set for January 14th to 19th. Mark your calendars. Bobbie Dewey is the coordinator.



Newsletter tip and topic:

I received this tip from Sandy Everett: Sorry for your experience Sandy, but thank you for the warning. You may save others that horrible experience.

If you regularly use Frixion pens to mark a quilt, be forewarned that it will not come out of batik fabrics. I used it for a lap quilt meant as a gift. When I discovered the marks didn't come out using steam, I went online where I discovered from a blog about Frixion pens that it does not come out of batiks easily. A product called Amodex was recommended, which I purchased online. I worked very hard to get out the markings on the lighter batiks. I didn't even attempt on the patterned fabrics, as the work was very labor intensive and required scrubbing with a brush and then laundering to remove the Amodex from the fabric.



How do you achieve the perfect quarter inch? These are some of the comments I received.

- 1 If your machine has a quarter inch foot, then it behooves you to buy it. It can be a game changer. Also, there is a magnetic guide you can use as well.
- 2 There is a ruler out there where you can line it up, put your needle down in the ¼ inch hole and then tape the quarter inch edge off so as to correctly line up your fabric.
- 3 Using a ruler line up your quarter inch, and use any kind of tape to build up a little edge to guide your fabric along.

All of these should be tested each time you begin sewing by taking two 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ strips. Sew together down the long side. Press the way you like and measure the square. It should be 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ square.
