Spring Into Quilting!

President's Letter:


Springtime Greetings!

As we approach the final months of our fiscal year, we are looking forward to our June Dinner Meeting at North Penn Gun Club, installing new officers, and preparing a budget for the coming year. (Budget prep not being the fun one of those three events!).

After much consideration by members responsible for various parts of our guild activities, Pat Royer, Jamee Pemberton, and I prepared a draft budget for the Board's review earlier this month. The Board made a few tweaks and unanimously approved submitting the final draft to the membership for review and vote. A copy was emailed to you a few weeks ago, I encourage you to review it so you understand what we are doing, how we are being fiscally responsible for the guild's assets, and why certain decisions are being made.

In an attempt to answer questions you may have, I will provide a bit of detail below. View the proposed budget emailed to you in conjunction with this further insight to compare numbers with explanations:

- First of all, unfortunately we are presenting a budget showing an overall deficit of \$139 for the year. This sounds disappointing in a quilt show year! But there is an explanation for this. It relates primarily to the new way we are distributing raffle quilt tickets. With members being asked to prepay for the raffle tickets, the significant income from those sales is being realized now instead of after July 1 when this new budget year starts. In previous quilt show years, the raffle ticket sale income was generally deposited in the same fiscal year as the show. Consequently, we will finish this year with this income (remember raffle ticket sales are 100% income to the guild!) recorded in the 23-24 year. The amount shifted to this year is anticipated to be about \$2500.
- Other details:
 - We are budgeting to have the new day retreat in Richlandtown in March 2025, but we anticipate the income and rental expense from that event will offset.
 - Dues (for the 25-26 guild year largely deposited before July 25) are anticipated to stay at \$35/year. There was discussion of increasing dues to \$40 to help cover our expenses, but the board is



- hoping to delay any increase at least one more year! We will begin to offer partial year membership after January for \$20 to encourage new members throughout the year.
- Guest fees will probably stay at \$10/meeting for most meetings. On a caseby-case basis, it is possible that a different fee will be set for a particular meeting.
- Interest income has been higher in the past year because of better rates on our CDs. We are assuming the rates will continue to be favorable.
- The retreat at Camp Innabah will be in January again; as in the past, we will
 pass the camp's fee along to participants and the guild will have no net
 expense or income from this event.
- The general meeting raffle is anticipated to bring income of \$100 to the guild, netting the ticket sales against the cost of prizes. (Note: donations for prizes are welcome—See Barb Harr.)
- The Quilt Show details have been given a great deal of thought by Sue and Kathy; they are focused on making this a wonderful event that yields a nice financial return for all our efforts. We will be increasing the admission to \$10 this year. The guild will retain 15% commission on boutique/recycle sales this year. Café prices will be increased slightly from previous years to cover the increasing cost of the food we purchase. Chance drawing will help to increase our profit because of the fabulous prizes our members contribute for guests to win—another source giving nearly 100% profit for the guild. We also made small changes to the fee to register a quilt this year. Vendors have been confirmed for the show (but that income is already posted in the current year.) On the expense side, it is probably no surprise that most of our costs are increasing. We rent poles and tables, give the church a donation for use of their fabulous facility, and pay a judge to come on site. We will have printing and postage costs for cards, programs, publicity, and signs. Most importantly, is the sale of tickets for the raffle quilt—we are counting on our members to do a yeoman's job of selling tickets, sending income directly to our bottom line (even if it is posted in a different budget year.) This quilt show budgeted income is over \$4000, but about \$3000 more hopefully being deposited before July 1 and is not being reflected in this 2024-2025 budget you are looking at.
- Meetings are our major expense: rental for the facilities we meet in and program fees for presenters are generally increasing. Rent (\$1355) and Programs (\$4000) are important to maintaining quality meetings for our members. Kathy Shorter does a superb job scheduling good programs for us while keeping an eye on the cost. We are also lucky to have the nice location and reasonable cost to meet in Richlandtown.
- A new expense line this budget year is a fee to reserve a location for a fundraiser event in our non-quilt-show year (anticipating October 2026). Sue Wilsey and Alicia Wilhelm are starting to research the intricacies of holding a Quilt BINGO fundraiser. There is potential for an event like this to yield significant income for our guild. As members, you will be hearing about how you can participate and contribute to the success of this event when we start



- to focus on it after this year's Quilt Show!
- Debbie Ott does a great job of working on Saturday Specials to try to keep these fun events revenue-neutral to the guild with attendee fees covering the cost for rent and teacher fees.
- And, we have small budget expenses related to Charity, December Tea, Library, our P O Box, Sunshine, Zoom Fee, Website license, and miscellaneous President's expenses.

The budget will be presented at our meeting in April, and we will be asking members to approve it at the May meeting. Please come prepared with an understanding of these details to make the meetings and discussions meaningful to all.

And, most important, thanks to all our members who did research and provided input into these numbers. It's a lot of work, and they did a great job!


QUILT SHOW 2024 – Our theme is *Star Struck*.

REMEMBER THIS NUMBER - 108 hours. That's how long it took to hand quilt the quilt. Invariably someone is going to ask you!


A record 3-1/2 weeks. **GREAT JOB**!!



The **registration forms** to enter your quilts into the show are now available. There will be paper forms available at the guild meetings or you can download it from our website. Problems filling it out or questions? Sometimes, this process appears daunting to members. Come to the Aug 3rd meeting (starting at 10 am) at Indian Valley Public Library and we will guide you through the steps. Please remember – for judging purposes – Entrants are limited to **TWO** entries per category!

Spring is a great time to work on getting your quilts ready to enter the quilt show. Do not forget making **mug rugs**, items for the chance auction and the boutique as well. Currently, we have over 171 mug rugs; a great start! They can be given to Gina Grekula at any time before the show. They are fast and easy to make. Be creative and use your scraps.

Raffle tickets are available starting at the March membership meeting. This year, to help keep our expenses down, we are asking members to pay for their raffle tickets (5 packs of 6 tickets for \$25) when they pick them up from Kelly Wenhold at the guild meeting. Please bring cash or check to do that! At the May meeting, Alicia Wilhelm will be handing out raffle tickets. We encourage ALL members to participate. Raffle quilt ticket purchases helps tremendously with the success of the quilt show! As always, you can purchase your 5 packs in smaller quantities or buy additional raffle tickets from Kelly at any guild meeting. We are selling raffle tickets at several places this year: Arts Alive on May 18th from 10am to 4pm, Perkasie Day on Aug 10, Coopersburg Community Day, and Pennsburg Community Day in September. People are needed to man the tables. It's a great day to sell tickets and let people know what our guild is about. If a ticket you sold wins, you get a seller prize. Over the years, our raffle quilts have been a great source of income for Keystone. Please do your best in selling raffle tickets!



Chance auction needs donations. Do you have an extra quilt product, material bundle, small quilt, or table runner that you can spare? Are you or your significant other talented in other crafts? Alicia Wilhelm will be collecting Chance Auction items. Our chance auction was fabulous last show and made a huge profit for Keystone! Thank you for your generosity.

Scraps will be sold at the show. Save scraps of fabric from 2½" to fat quarters. If you have a larger piece, please sell in the boutique with a #1 code, and benefit the guild.

There will be **Demonstrations** at the show. We need volunteers to teach them. Do you have a talent or know a need that can be demonstrated in a short period of time? Jean Perry is organizing the schedule for demonstrations at our Quilt Show (just a couple of months away) and as you finish up your quilts and prepare them for the Show (ⓐ), would you also consider sharing your knowledge of any quilting topic for a 30-minute Demo? (it goes by fast!)

Volunteers - Joan Cahill will be setting up a table at our regular guild meetings for signups for the Quilt Show. Get there early to sign up for the areas you would like to work in. We need lots of member participation to pull off a successful show!!! Our guild thrives only if we help it to do so. Volunteer where you can to make this show, the success we know it can be. There will be signup sheets at the next couple guild meetings. Sign up for multiple positions at various times if you like variety, but ultimately, sign up. The dates of the show have been known for a while and should be blocked off on your calendar.

Kitchen Help: Looking to recruit volunteers for the 2024 Quilt Show kitchen (prep, bakers, soup makers, and the ever-popular Deviled Egg makers). The kitchen and its products have always been a hit. Alicia Wilhelm did a wonderful job at organizing and executing the barn quilt class. The day was enjoyable, everyone learned something, and all the pictures were different.




Do you remember being asked for a heart square for the farm show?





Newsletter tip and topic:

To organize your sewing room, many quilters wrap their material in comic board. Did you ever realize you have other options?

I have tried to recycle my cardboard and have used cereal box fronts and backs, flaps of boxes received from Amazon or all those other online quilt stores... you know you have them. I have also started to measure my material and tag it on top so I have an idea of how much I have left. This saves me from unravelling each time I think I want to use it. How do I tag it? I write on a 2 – 3 inch piece of selvage and pin it on. Later, if I need a new count, I can use that selvage piece for my starter/ender piece while sewing. Win/win!

FOR NEXT NEWSLETTER: How do you achieve the perfect quarter inch? Let me know (kammler@comcast.net) and I will pass it along for others. Do you eyeball it? Do you use a quarter inch foot? Do you measure before the start of each project? Do you mark it with tape or something else? If so, how do you set the marking and how often do you "check" it. I'll pass your tips along.


